

Glass wreath


Step 1 Use a pie plate or a heart-shaped cake pan

Step 2

Place a heavy soup can or anything heavy and round in the centre for the middle hole

Step 3

Use warm water to fill the pie pan (warm water will make a clearer ice)





Use what you have around the house to make your wreath interesting, such as Cinnamon sticks Pepper corns, frozen cranberries Rosemary, cedar, twigs, rose petals.

Step 5

Put outside overnight until frozen all the way through.

Step 7

Run under warm water to remove from pie dish.

Hang outside and enjoy the beauty

How to Make Ice Candle Holders

What you need:

- Bucket or large bowl
- Water (I used cold water but I've been told that hot water makes the ice more clear.)
- Freezing weather
- · Candle (I used real ones that were half burnt and looking a little ugly, but battery operated ones can also be used.)

Fill the bucket with water up to an inch from the top. Put it outside overnight. Approximately 12 to 14 hours is required for the water to freeze. It freezes from the outside inward.

In the morning bring the bucket of ice in and turn it upside down in the sink. You might have to wait a minute or two until the ice drops from the bucket. You will see that the ice outsides are frozen and thick. The top (which use to be the bottom), is thin ice and maybe watery. Tip the ice bucket over a bit and If you are lucky, the unfrozen water can just be poured out. Unlucky people may have to poke the centre a bit.

Place the candle inside.
